1. OSCE Station writing

DATE: 23 March or 15 June, 12H45 – 16H30

VENUE: Clinical skills centre

WHO SHOULD ATTEND: If you are involved in creating OSCE stations (or want to get involved), this workshop will help you create great stations!

DESCRIPTION: During the workshop, you will have the opportunity to write, try out and get feedback on a complete OSCE station. You will learn how to create different station types, e.g. communication, examination and practical skills. You will also learn how best to use Simulated Patients (SPs) and manikins.

2. OSCE Examiner training

DATE: 20 April or 26 July, 12h45 – 16h30

VENUE: Clinical skills centre

WHO SHOULD ATTEND? Are you aware that your performance as an examiner in an OSCE can have a large influence on students' results? Anyone who has been an OSCE examiner in a departmental OSCE or an external examiner and who wants to know more about doing this effectively should attend this workshop. And if you will soon be a "first time" OSCE examiner, then this is the best place to start your preparation!

DESCRIPTION: This workshop will focus on the influence of the examiner on the quality of the assessment and explains how to help ensure that results reflect the student's performance rather than your performance as examiner. You will learn how assessors differ in the way that they rate students and how these differences can be diminished. You will also learn how to use different types of score sheets appropriately as well how to sharpen your skills as an observer.

3. Masterclass : OSCE Design

DATE: 20 September, 10h00 – 16h00

VENUE: Clinical skills centre

WHO SHOULD ATTEND: This workshop is a must for anyone who has (or may soon have!) the responsibility for designing an OSCE.

Please note that to attend this workshop, you must have attended the other two workshops in the series.

DESCRIPTION: In this workshop, you will learn about issues such as standard setting, focusing on the borderline regression method; different methods of blueprinting; validity and reliability; the logistics that support a valid and reliable OSCE; and how to do SP and examiner training.
